Freda Bartle 1919 - 2007

It is with great regret that we announce to members that one of our two life members, Freda Bartle, has died. Freda was the widow of CATS founder member and former editor of this journal Alan Bartle G6HC and was accorded life membership of CATS in recognition of her support and association with the society over many years.

Andy Briers G0KZT who knew both of them well has kindly contributed the following.

I have learned that the widow of the late Alan Bartle G6HC, Freda, died on Tuesday 4th December in hospital after losing her battle against a number of health problems. She was just weeks from her 88th birthday on Christmas Eve. Freda was cremated at the South London Crematorium on Wednesday 19th December where her ashes were laid along with Alan's in the

main garden of remembrance. She leaves behind their sole daughter Alison.

I first met Freda in about 1982 after I first met Alan. At that time both Freda and Alan were retired and Freda warmly welcomed me into their home. Freda had retired from the Civil Service, the Land Registry I believe, and one of her main hobbies was embroidery. I remember that she was a great fan of LBC radio and I always remember getting into discussions about the topic of the day. She also enjoyed Countdown, the Channel 4 television programme, and 15 to 1.

I was guilty of introducing both Freda and Alan to Eastenders (something I'm not too proud about!).

Freda was also an excellent cook and I sampled many a hearty meal, and when I was old enough, because I was only 15 in those days, accompanied with a good German wine. Once a week I would go over to Alan and Freda's for my RAE class that again, always finished with a meal. When I finally gained the callsign G1IRM, the Mr Kiplings Manor House cake that was routinely rolled out on each occasion was renamed "IRM" cake. It's still referred to as that to this day!

Freda was a loyal and supporting wife of Alan, especially during his illness. Alan, as well as being involved in Amateur Radio, being a member of a number of clubs and societies, was also involved in the Territorial Army. She seemed so tolerant of his activities, a quality that is often taken for granted.

Freda designed the cat logo that looks over the wall on the CATS Bazaar poster, and she was the proofreader for the newsletter when Alan was the editor. She enjoyed reading CATS Whispers that was forwarded on to her each month.

Many members will recall that Martin G4FKK likes to run a brief local chat net on Christmas morning on top band with the only rule being that it is conducted using good old Amplitude Modulation. For several years he called CQ on 1942 kHz with no response but for the past couple of years, he has been joined by an increasing number of CATS members who take a brief timeout from family obligations to join in and put an old rig on the air or try out a little-used mode.

“The photo shows me in the new shack with my grandson from EA-land (Martin Beal-Gonzalez) on my knee. I am holding an old Acos crystal mike in my left hand and the grey box on the right is my original top band transmitter from 1967 used on this year's AM Christmas day net. It has a 5763 in the PA, modulated by a 6BW6 into a quarter wave wire. The dial is an Eddystone 598.”

Other participants included M3JXN trying out AM on the CATS IC706, G8JAC using a 1970s Clansman RT321 that has real double sideband AM, and of course G4FKK using a homebrew TX and HRO receiver.

TransPONDer net news

Unfortunately, the New Year TransPONDer net couldn't be held on the customary first Saturday of the year because of difficulties at the US end in getting the Internet link set up to the repeater. Fortunately, G8JAC was able to spread the word amongst the usual participants at this end so nobody wasted their time. They include Hellschreiber, PSK31 and PSK125, DominoEX and RTTY of course. The individual files do have to be downloaded but are very small mp3 files which of course you can download into your iPod or whatever new gadget you got for Christmas.

Contesting 2008

With the New Year underway, thoughts have turned to contesting plans for 2008. As a first event the committee have decided that we will enter the 144 + 432 MHz contest on the first weekend in March that we have entered for the past few years. The exact dates of the contest are the 1st and 2nd of March and it's become known amongst the hardy few as the “Brass Monkey” contest after the somewhat chilly one a couple of years ago.

Our contest secretary Andy G0KZT will need to know who is going to participate so please let him know as soon as possible what you can do and when. Subject to confirmation, we will be using our usual site at Nore Hill, on the B269 at Woldingham.

It will also be the first opportunity to try out our new mast kit, which means that there is a bit of work to do to prepare for mounting our antenna systems on it. To make up quick-assembly mountings for the Yagis, we need some 40mm OD aluminium tubing with reasonably thick walls. The 40mm is a maximum dimension and is fairly critical for strength and stability. Unfortunately, standard scaffold tubing doesn't meet the requirements being the wrong diameter and usually too heavy. We need a length of about 10 feet in order to get the optimum spacing between the antennas. If you know of any suitable tubing, please let G8JAC know.

Committee Ramblings

The new committee members, fresh from their press-ganging at the AGM are getting to grips with society business. Steve G3WZK has jumped in to take on responsibility for CATS publicity – a job that is essential for the future health of the society and amateur radio. Sunspots are back!

Announced on the RSGB website, according to the Solar Influences Data Analysis Center, Solar Cycle 24 has begun. In a report issued on 4 January 2008, a high latitude sunspot group was identified. The group, first noted by the Catania solar observatory, has been identified using the butterfly rule as the first in Cycle 24.

After the last few years of flat conditions, we can now look forward to a steady improvement in HF propagation until the cycle peaks, which is expected to be around 2013.

Cray Valley RS presents:

At its meeting on Thursday, 21st February 2008 the members of Cray Valley Radio Society in Eltham will host a presentation by Justin Snow (G4TSH) and Chris Duckling (G3SVL). These were two of the UK team to the expedition to the St. Brandon Islands in the Indian Ocean during September 2007 using the call sign "3B7C". The international team of twenty well-known radio operators made over 137,000 contacts from the Islands during their stay.

This was an 'amateur radio' DX'pedition to the Cargados Carajos Shoals (also known as the Saint Brandon Rocks) which are a group of about 16 small islands and islets on an extended reef in the Indian Ocean northeast of Mauritius. The reef measures more than 50 km from north to south, and is 5 km wide, cut by three passes. The islands have a small population, made up of natives as well as others, and are rich in flora and fauna. The islands are classified as a dependency of Mauritius, which is more than 300 km south, and are administered from Port Louis.

Both Justin and Chris will answer questions about the DX'pedition and present unique film taken by the team during their stay. This will show not only the event itself; but the logistics leading up to their arrival in that distant part of the world. The team consisted of radio amateurs – not only from the UK – but also from as far afield as the USA right round the world to Japan, via Europe and Asia.
