Membership Matters

It is regrettably that time of year again that we have to remind members that their subscriptions are now due. Those members who attended the AGM and the New Year Dinner were an easy target of course and their subscriptions were collected then. For the remaining members, society rules provide that two months are allowed for renewal to be made.

As will be seen from the minutes of the AGM, the treasurer explained that to meet our basic expenditure of hire of the hall, refreshments, postage etc in the face of ever-rising costs, it was reluctantly necessary to raise the basic subscription to £12 per year. Those over 65 will continue to benefit from a 50% reduction.

The rules give members until 1st March to renew, failing which they will be deemed to have resigned from the society. Make sure that you have renewed. *We don't want to lose you!*

Contesting 2008 #1.

Our first crack at contesting for 2008 kicks off with the 144/432 MHz contest that we have entered for the past few years. This takes place over the first weekend in March and after the experience of 2006, is known to our group of diehards as the "Brass Monkey" contest. Most of the usual band of regulars have already volunteered for duty but of course all members are very welcome to help, operate, make the tea or just drop in to say hello and see how we are getting on. If you can't make it up to the site, then fire up the rig and give G4FUR/P a call. Every point helps!

The site is our usual one at Nore Hill, the field on the west side of the B269 Croydon Road at Woldingham - about a mile past Sainsbury's going south. The map reference is **TQ386564**. We will be setting up camp and the stations from about 11.00 on Saturday 1st March. The person to speak to if you have any questions or to say that you can help is our contests secretary, Andy G0KZT, or call G3ZMF at home.

This contest will be the first opportunity to use our new mast kit. Andy G8JAC and Paul M3JXN took advantage of one of the first weekends when it didn't rain to try out the kit and get used to how it all goes together. A "trial erection" as it was delicately put. This went very well and the result can be seen on the right. Being designed for military use, the kit is very robustly constructed but goes together quickly and easily and can be put up by two men*. The four legs mean that it is quite stable when free standing and there are four guys that attach to the top at the 40 foot point for additional stability and safety. Hopefully the somewhat hair-raising shoving and heaving needed to get the old mast up are now a thing of the past. The picture (right) shows the bare mast; our pair of 17-element Yagis will mount on the top giving the upper one a height of some 50 feet.

The mast kit includes a stirrup type air pump that conveniently provides some useful exercise as well as pumping the mast up, which it does surprisingly quickly. We also have a small 12v compressor which while it does the job, takes considerably longer.

Once up, the whole mast can be easily rotated by means of a pair of handles rather like a submarine periscope. A calibrated compass ring allows easy setting to any desired bearing.

* No apologies for mentioning men here; this is a beefy bit of kit! Exceptions made for Russian shot putt champions or equivalent of course.

RSGB Top Ham Competition at Kempton Rally 6 April 2008
