July Meeting Report

At our meeting on July 12th we welcomed Dr Alison Johnston, G8ROG, our RSGB Regional Representative, who gave us a most interesting two part talk.

First, Alison talked about PLA (Power Line Adaptors), and PLT (Power Line Telecommunications). Starting with the history of these technologies and a brief description of how they work, she explained the work being done by the RSGB to counter the threat that they present.

PLT uses electricity supply cables to provide broadband access but is being phased out in the next 18 months. PLA, however is much more of a problem. Existing systems radiate in the MF and HF bands (1 to 30 MHz) and despite "notching" of the amateur bands, they can cause significant interference outside a laboratory environment.

Bridge rectifiers in some domestic power supplies can act as mixers, so that when presented with the spurii generated by various switched mode supplies (often inside a computer) around a typical house together with the PLA signals, intermodulation effects cause notched out amateur bands to become very noisy.

However, the latest systems, which operate at data rates in the Gbit/s region, radiate in the 40 to 300 MHz region and can completely wipe out even high power VHF Band 2 and DAB broadcast transmissions.

Alison went on to describe work being done under RSGB auspices to tackle the problem such as:

- Technical demonstrations of the issues at the national EMCUK exhibition in Newbury (this year on 12/13 October at Newbury Racecourse)
- Working with UK Universities to ensure that the design engineers of the future understand the issues involved
- Providing stands at trade shows
- Working with trading standards authorities
- Tackling OFCOM
- Setting up the Spectrum Defence Fund

G8ROG spent some time on the two last points. It's too complicated to describe fully in *Cats Whispers*, but it involves raising enough money to be able to take Ofcom to court if

necessary to compel them to undertake what the RSGB considers to be their statutory obligations. Interestingly, the UK military are also very worried about PLT developments but being a Crown organisation, are unable to initiate litigation in this respect.

Alison also touched on proposals for broadcast VHF FM radio to be phased out and replaced by DAB Plus. (DAB itself - Digital Audio Broadcasting - is also to be phased out in favour of DAB Plus. In the CATS catchment area, this will be in late 2012/ early 2013.)

In the second part of the talk, after a break for refreshments, Alison gave members a useful explanation about the RSGB today, how it is managed and about her personal responsibilities. The latter includes liaising with 78 affiliated clubs and societies.

She also hinted at some developments expected soon, such as:

- Improvements to the RSGB regional website from this autumn
- A 200 kHz-wide slice of spectrum at 5MHz may become available soon
- Phased launch of Radcom on the internet, initially targeted at younger members

Finally, Alison rounded off a very interesting evening by showing some of the material that the RSGB can provide to local clubs staging events that the public are invited to attend. These include various leaflets and posters, plus badges and stickers suitable for handing out to young people after they have been on the radio to send greetings messages.

Many thanks to Alison for such an informative evening; we look forward to seeing you again in two years' time!
