



July Meeting Debrief - /P Operation, Headley Common

I am grateful to David G6VMI and Glenn G4FVL who have sent in some photos taken whilst /P at Headley Common. David writes that his station consisted of FT817, 50w HF linear, Auto ATU, Swr/power meter, Receiver (not connected), antenna controller and an Ata120 screwdriver hf antenna. Also in pictures is F9FT Tonna 9ele portable on 144 MHz. Mast is 7 section aluminium telescopic cut down to collapsed length to fit across width of car boot but is still tall enough to reach the roof of my house.



Glenn, who provided the latter two photos writes, "A pleasant social evening with a little radio added to the mix, Members attending were Edd G0JOS David G6VMI, Vince G1HRD, Martin G4GFI and myself G4FVL. I arrived around 19:45 after Edd and David. Edd had managed to set up a long wire and was attempting to conduct some HF activity and David was setting up, Vince and Martin arrived a little later. I attempted to conduct some experiments using my Ranger 9 antenna with a mag mount stuck to the rear of my car roof, Unfortunately, while I could hear a reasonable amount of stations on 20 metres, alas they could not hear me running low power at 2 watts or so into something not much bigger than a welding rod! I decided to re configured the antenna for 2 meters but unfortunately got sucked into or more likely instigated a conversation with the guys about ideas for future CATS talks and events".

I welcome all contributions that members and others send in for publication in CATS Whispers but following last month's article about Automatic Dependant Surveillance – Broadcast ADS-B that was sent in by Gerry G8NNT and following publication, it was brought to my attention that such technology may be illegal to participate in. This is in respect to acting on or fowarding information which was not intended for the receiver to hear.

Gerry had forwarded the information in good faith on behalf of another 3rd party. Neither CATS, Gerry or the editor can not be held responsible for material not directly written by themsleves.

Club Callsigns G4FUR and M1FUR – In the days of A and B licences, the club applied for in addition to G4FUR, M1FUR for the then 'B' licencees to use. Of course, when the licencing structure changed, by default to club continued to hold what are now both full licences. I have continued to administer both licences with OFCOM and have been fully revalidated. While I generally use G4FUR on the club nets (no need to had /A or /P because they are registered at QTH of G0KZT or that it is even now a licence condition to actually do so) I would dearly like to hear both callsigns in use to help promote the Society. Of course, you would have to be a full licence holder to operate without supervision, but I believe the majority of members hold full licences.

A simple text message or email in advance of any use should suffice to prevent one of the callsigns being used by more than one station at a time. All I would ask is that a copy of any logging is sent to me via any of the available email addresses. The GX club prefix can be used at the members' discretion.

SWOT

Contest News

CATS remain in 12th position in the local clubs' section of the UK Activity Contests. This is the situation at nearly the end of July to meet the needs of CW publication, but it doesn't include all the results of some July contests – those for 4m and 23cm. This has probably not affected our overall position.

This month I'm going to look at the 70cm position and the contribution of club members. CATS are presently 10th in the 70cm Restricted (100w, single antenna) section. This is made up from Martin G4GFI in 17th personal position, Tom G8GYX (G4DFA) in 34th, myself (G3YCR) up to 79th with five monthly contests this year so far and Edd G0JOS/P in 123rd, (three contest entries and an improving position). I don't think there were any other CATS entrants, but apologies if I've missed anyone. This could easily improve as the year goes on. Next month I'll look at the 23cm position.

We should also congratulate Martin G4GFI for coming 6th in the Six Hour Single Operator Fixed 6m Trophy contest on 17th June on behalf of CATS. For this he used his newly acquired contest callsign M3C.

MFR Scotland by Laurence GM4DMA/KL7L

Here's something that may interest some folk for the newsletter from our visit to the UK last year – Im still trying to see if anyone is left up in Scotland at the station that may recall some of this!

In the Mid 1980's I was living in NE Scotland and often tuned to 1107KHz and the sounds of one of my favourite local radio stations "MFR". On the hour the station they had a natty 6 tone station ident "Moray-Firth- Ra(y)-Dee-ohhh)" – it was really distinctive.

Opened in 1982 this very popular station still serves Inverness and coastal NE Scotland along the Firth as far East as Fraserburgh and on a good day as far North as Wick and beyond

In the later 1980's I was the base commander, science and communications lead for a series of attempts at pulling 400 pound plus sledges from the Northern coast of Canada to the Geographic North pole led by the famous explorer Sir Ran Fiennes.

The expeditions were named PUNS, for Polar Unsupported - and had a multifaceted Earth science portfolio, anything from air and snow and flora sampling, meteorology, and ionospherics', and raising money for charity, beyond the physical goal of reaching the nigh impossible aim for Ran and his partner to reach Pole over the ever shifting and torturous ice covered Arctic Ocean

We were based in a small canvas hut on Ward Hunt island at 82 North 74 West, one of the closest land points to the Pole and where Ran and partner started their expedition – we had short wave transmitters and communicated with Ran, once a day to report progress or problems and maintained a full 24 hour watch – small antennas held up with ski poles attached to the tent at Rans end and large dipoles and similar at ours. Daytime temperatures were often in the -50C and with a stiff wind it wasn't easy living.

We were looking at how the Aurora affected radio communications and kept a record of Solar and Geomagnetic activity. Auroras typically danced overhead most night, as they do in Northern Scotland.

In 1988 before leaving Scotland I contacted MFRs chief engineer and posed a question to him on the possibility of hearing MFR from near the North Pole, thousands of miles away. I had noticed at local midnight 1107kHz became really quiet and the stations that shared the frequency in Europe were all silent for just a few seconds.

I posed to him the idea of playing the MFR jingle not once but a few times in this "silence" period at midnight Scottish time as its distinctive tune may be audiable. He said he would see what could be done and just before we left for the Pole he called and said Ok (yay!).

I was delighted to report back to him later that MFR's natty jingle came through our speaker in our remote Polar hut clearly and for a couple of nights between Solar storms. On some nights is was so strong it fought off the other stations who shared the frequency and we listened to music from our home town area.

The reason Im recalling this up now is we were in Inverness at Eden Court to meet Ran Fiennes a few weeks back. Ran was giving a lecture on his varied and exciting life and exploits, and we had flown from Alaska and driven to Inverness after meeting up with my stepdaughter/granddaughter in Aberdeen.

As we drove through the highlands and coastal towns mentioned in MFR's jingles of the past, the memories all came flooding back – it was so good to be listening to be hearing MFR again and congrats on the 40 Candles Birthday! May the jingle never stop.




